Plastic Free Hawai'i School Mural Contest

Details

Theme: Bring your vision of a Plastic Free Hawai'i to life.
 Imagine a world with less plastic and how students, schools, families, and communities can be part of the solution. Choose an inspiring message or action to share!



- Who can participate? Students and school groups, grades K-12. Entries must be submitted by a Teacher, Organization, or Parent on behalf of a student, a group of students, a club, a class, a grade level, or an entire school.
- Materials: Incorporate marine debris, plastic bottle caps, or any other single-use plastic items collected from cleanups or recycling drives. Tell us the story of where your materials came from in your Entry Form.



- Format: Email a digital high-resolution "actual size" jpeg (1MB or 1.5MB minimum size). Additional detail shots are welcome if your mural is large in scope.
- Criteria: Murals will be judged on use of found or reused materials, visual appeal, creativity, and integration of the theme.
- Entry Form: Each submission must be accompanied by an Entry Form that includes a description of your mural explaining how your materials were collected, who was involved in the planning and creating your mural, what your plastic free message is, and why it is important to you.
- Submissions: Entries must be emailed by February 23, 2018.

Teachers, have individual students complete a brainstorm sketch for the mural then work as a team to merge ideas into one collaborative project.
